### Today's Gospel Matthew 11, 2-11

#### Messengers from John the Baptist

When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, those with a skin disease are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. And blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me."

#### Jesus Praises John the Baptist

As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? What, then, did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. What, then, did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written,

'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.'

"Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist, yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

#### **Update on South Aisle Roofing repairs**

We hope this informs everyone of the difficulties that the Contractors have experienced in the last six weeks.

The works involved stripping out 4 courses of tiles to each side of the valley gutter to enable new carpentry works to be laid to the correct bay lengths and falls in order to comply with regulations.

Followed were the supply and fit new code 8 leadworks with associated flashings and retiling.

Since given the instruction to start the above works, we have been heavily impeded with severe inclement weather - persistent rain and wind incorporating 2 storms.

After stripping out the tiling and lead for working, we have covered back in with polythene membrane in order to keep out the rainwater.

This is a difficult task as we have 2 large roof elevations either side of the valley gutter picking up all the rainfall and heading to the gutter, which when not completed is at its weakest.

There have been several days when we have not attended site to uncover the valley gutter as the weather forecast was poor.

The sequence is to get as many new bays ready as possible for recovering in lead, then tile back in. These take some time to complete and cannot be done in bad weather.

Whilst writing the above, we have now completed all lead works to the bays and are retiling back in aiming for completion early next week.

Due to the weather we have experienced, we apologise for any inconvenience that has been caused by the works, as the duration has been extended much longer than originally anticipated.
